Supporting LGBTQ+ Youth and Families in LA County For Providers



Serving LGBTQ+ Communities (UCLA Wellbeing for LA Learning Center)

A learning tool designed to increase knowledge and comfort with concepts related to gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation. This curriculum provides tools for more affirming communication when interaction with LGBTQ+ people, teaches how to respond when someone comes out as LGBTQ+, and offers tips around pronouns.

Protecting Confidentiality of LGBTQ+ People

A handout that provides simple guidance about what to do and what to avoid to protect privacy and confidentiality of LGBTQ+ people, including LGBTQ+ students in schools. This handout can be used to understand the requirements of LGBTQ+ confidentiality.

This communications resource is designed to help advocates, educators, policymakers, and the public talk effectively and persuasively about supporting transgender youth. It is grounded in research on adolescent development and the science of what helps transgender young people thrive.
